Agency Overview:

Position Overview:

This person will serve as the Clinical Team Leader for the High Risk Mental Health Team. The purpose of the Guilford Trauma Response Team is to provide onsite evidence-based and trauma-informed mental health services to high risk and underserved crime victims at the Guilford County Family Justice Center (both Greensboro and High Point), with a particularly focus on homicide response. This is a 40 hour per week leadership position.

Duties and Responsibilities

- A. Serve as a Clinical Team Leader for the High Risk Mental Health Team by supervising day-to-day operations and providing daily oversight and management of team members, activities, and service delivery. This includes monitoring compliance with all policies and procedures for clinical care such as periodic chart monitoring/audits, recruitment strategies, and coordination of care across team members (25% of time)
- B. Deliver clinical services to underserved victims as part of the team, including assessments, brief therapy, or group therapy as needed based on client demand. (50% of time)
- C. Serve as the liaison between the two FJC sites (Greensboro and High Point)
- D. Attend and/or deliver victim outreach events that assist with smooth service access and utilization for crime victims (15%)
- E. Work with the Project Director and team to ensure that we hit all grant deliverables by attending and leading all project staff meetings and assisting project reports (10%)
- F. Other duties as assigned

Supervisory: This position is supervised by the Project Director.

Personal Qualities: Experience providing trauma-specific behavioral health services, ability to manage and lead a small clinical team, strong ability to multi-task on multi-component projects, strong organizational skills, attention to detail, must be dependable and accountable with a passion to serve the community

Position Structure: 40 hours per week

Travel: Local travel for project team meetings across Guilford County

Salary: Salary commensurate upon experience.

Qualifications: Masters or PhD in Counseling, Psychology, Social Work or a related field, licensed to provide services in the state of North Carolina. Preferred experience: At least 3 years in direct service experience, knowledge of trauma and traumatic stress, ability to work in interdisciplinary teams, evidence of coordination of complex cases, experience working with diverse populations, and strong verbal and written communication skills.
