Position Overview:

This person will serve as a Clinician for the High Risk Mental Health Team in either the Greensboro or High Point location. The purpose of the Guilford Trauma Response Team is to provide onsite evidence-based and trauma-informed mental health services to high risk and underserved crime victims at the Guilford County Family Justice Center (both Greensboro and High Point), with a particularly focus on homicide response. This is a 40 hour per week leadership position.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- A. Provide direct clinical services, including assessments, individual therapy, group therapy (as needed) to uninsured adults with co-occurring disorders.
- B. Work with the Clinical Team Leader to coordinate care and ensure compliance with all policies and procedures
- C. Attend weekly project team meetings and events as scheduled
- D. Work as part of an interdisciplinary team, yet also working independently with caseload
- E. Be dependable and accountable
- F. Maintain confidentiality of records and comply with all policies and procedures related to client care
- G. Other duties as assigned

Supervisory: This position is supervised by the Clinical Team Leader

Personal Qualities: Experience providing trauma-specific behavioral health services, ability to manage and lead a small clinical team, strong ability to multi-task on multi-component projects, strong organizational skills, attention to detail, must be dependable and accountable with a passion to serve the community

Position Structure: 40 hours per week

Travel: Local travel for project team meetings across Guilford County

Salary: Salary commensurate upon experience.

Qualifications: Masters or PhD in Counseling, Psychology, Social Work or a related field, licensed to provide services in the state of North Carolina. Preferred experience and training on knowledge of trauma and traumatic stress, ability to work in interdisciplinary teams, evidence of coordination of complex cases, experience , working with diverse populations, and strong verbal and written communication skills.
