Position Overview:

This person will serve as a Clinician for the Seeds of Hope in Guilford County. The purpose of the Seeds of Hope program is to expand our community’s capacity to “realize, recognize, and respond” to youth crime victims impacted by addiction through the implementation of trauma-informed service practices. Through Seeds of Hope, we hope to make two main impacts: (1) enhance community coordination and mobilization to respond to the needs of youth victims of the addiction crisis in our community; and, (2) increase access by delivering evidence-based, trauma-informed treatment and services to youth crime victims impacted by the addiction crisis. This is a 40 hour per week position.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- A. Provide direct clinical services, including assessments, individual therapy, group therapy (as needed) to youth impacted by the addiction crisis. (75%)
- B. Work with the Clinical Team Leader to coordinate care and ensure compliance with all policies and procedures and attend weekly project team meetings (5%)
- C. Assist with the coordination and delivery of victim outreach events (10%)
- D. Attend community collaborative meetings related to youth victim services to coordinate efforts around youth and addictions (5%)
- E. Track client outcomes using the project-approved data collection process (5%)
- F. Work as part of an interdisciplinary team, yet also working independently with caseload
- G. Be dependable and accountable
- H. Maintain confidentiality of records and comply with all policies and procedures related to client care
- I. Other duties as assigned

Supervisory: This position is supervised by the Clinical Team Leader

Personal Qualities: Experience providing trauma-specific behavioral health services, strong ability to multi-task on multi-component projects, strong organizational skills, attention to detail, must be dependable and accountable with a passion to serve the community

Position Structure: 40 hours per week

Travel: Local travel for project team meetings across Guilford County

Salary: Salary commensurate upon experience.

Benefits Package: Benefits will include employer paid health insurance for employee (optional addition of spouse/dependents), long term disability, 24/7 access to teledoc, group life insurance, and retirement match. Additional employee paid optional benefits include of dental, vision, and supplemental coverage policies.

Qualifications: Masters or PhD in Counseling, Psychology, Social Work or a related field, licensed to provide services in the state of North Carolina, with preference for LCAS experience or experience working with co-occurring mental health and substance use populations. Preferred experience and training on knowledge of trauma and traumatic stress, ability to work in interdisciplinary teams, evidence of coordination of complex cases, experience , working with diverse populations, and strong verbal and written communication skills.
